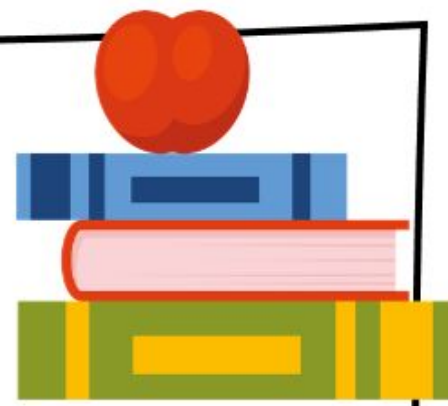

OUR LEARNING SNAPSHOT:

Writing: This week, the students started writing personal narratives about their favorite summer memory.

Reading: We read our first story together as a class, *Marisol Doesn't Match*. The story is about a girl named Marisol who feels different from everyone else. She learns that being different is something to be proud of. Marisol shows us that we don't have to match everyone else to belong. What makes us different can also make us special.

Grammar: This week, we practiced our sentence-writing skills.

Phonics: This week in phonics, we took a pretest and practiced identifying short vowel sounds.

Math: This week in math, we learned two different strategies for solving multiplication problems. We learned how to use arrays and number lines to find the product.

Science: This week in science, we started our unit on the Solar System.

Social Studies: This week in social studies, we learned what an inquiry is and explored the inquiry process.

Religion: In religion, we learned what it means to be in communion with God and others. We are set to have our first test next week. The students did a great job practicing and memorizing their first memory verse!
