 - Told the Gospel story
 - Worked together as community
 - Worshipped God
 - Helped people in need.

- Need to dialogue well within the PC and with parishioners. Fr. Jim handed out the book Redeeming Conflict which covers how to have creative tension between different groups of people.
- A challenge of our generation in Church is to shift from being customers to being coworkers in mission.
- Highest priority is bringing people to Jesus Church is only valuable in how well this priority is accomplished.
- Covered the template for PC meetings

- Experiences in Church that have been bad.
- How would you describe the faith community to someone who has never been there before?
