The Holy Spirit has given each of us gifts. How are you called by the Spirit, like the early Church, to share your gifts to further the kingdom of God? Your response to this call enables Our Catholic Community to fulfill its mission to love God and others, celebrate the Eucharist, and make disciples.

This booklet highlights the ministries which are most in need of help. We ask that you prayerfully review these ministries, asking how the Spirit is calling you to serve to further His work here in Our Catholic Community.

Top Areas of Need

- 1. Persons, including students and families, to serve as **committed and substitute adorers** to spend time with Jesus during adoration:
- Wednesdays at St. Charles 9 am 9 pm.
- Tuesdays at St. Joseph after the 6:30 pm Mass until 8 pm.
- 2. Persons, including students and families, to serve as **meal leaders or helpers** for the St. Charles Saturday Meal and the St. Joseph Thursday Suppers.

3. Altar Servers

- Students & adult men to serve at the altar for the Saturday Masses 4:30 pm at St. Joseph and 7:00 pm at St. Charles.
- Adult man from St. Mary to serve as a mentor to the St. Mary's altar servers.
- 4. Persons, including students and families, to serve as **ushers and ministers of hospitality** for the St. Joseph 4:30pm Mass and the St. Charles 11:00am Mass.
- 5. Person to serve as a **sacristan** for the St. Joseph 4:30pm Mass.
- 6. Persons to serve on teams to **coordinate funeral lunches** at St. Charles.
- 7. Persons from St. Charles, St. Joseph and St. Mary to staff the **Welcome and Information Hub** after the weekend Masses.

Then we need your help!

Did you know that we serve delicious & nutritious meals to over 100 people in need in the Greenville community every Saturday and in the Belding community on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month?

St. Charles needs helpers & meal leaders for the Saturday meal shifts. Being a meal helper is something that individuals, students & families can do. You don't even have to know how to cook!

St. Joseph needs substitute delivery drivers and substitute team members.

3--Serving At The Altar

Are You A Person Who:

- Wants a deeper relationship with Jesus?
- Desires to grow in understanding of the Mass?
- Seeks opportunities to serve God?
- Wants to be part of helping the parish offer reverent worship?

Then we need your help!

To serve at the altar is a great privilege and honor. It requires a willingness to serve, training, dedication, discipline, and a prayerful attitude.

As Pope Francis recently said "Serving at the altar is a privileged way to draw closer to Jesus....the closer you are to the altar, the more you will remember to speak with Jesus in daily prayer."

In building the next generation of servers, we are looking for adult men to serve at the altar to inspire more young people to serve, and to mentor and assist with training.

Students and adult men are needed to serve at the Saturday 4:30 pm Mass at St. Joseph and the 7:00 pm Mass at St. Charles.

An adult man from St. Mary is needed to mentor the St. Mary's altar servers.

4--Serve As An Usher Or Minister of Hospitality

Are You A Person Who:

- · Is outgoing and likes meeting people?
- Is a good listener?
- Likes to help people feel welcomed, included & appreciated?
- Can hold the door open with a smile?

Then we need your help!

Consider becoming a minister of hospitality at St. Charles or an usher at St. Joseph-St. Mary. We invite individuals, students and families to join this ministry!

St. Charles is looking for **twelve** more ministers of hospitality for the 11:00 am Mass. Ideally we should have 8-person teams who serve every four weeks. This requires at least 32 people committed to serve on a regular basis. Can you commit to serving as a minister of hospitality about once per month?

St. Joseph needs **six** more ushers for the 4:30 pm Mass. St. Joseph-St. Mary ushers serve in a two-person team for a month, once or twice a year. Ushers are needed at St. Joseph for the months of July, August and December. Can you commit to serving for one of these months?

5-- Serve As A Sacristan

Are You A Person Who:

- Is serious about your faith?
- Is able to get to church an hour before Mass?
- Is willing to help set up the sacred vessels before Mass and clean them after Mass?
- Can check to make sure all liturgical minister spots are filled for the Mass and corral ministers as needed?

Then we need your help!

Consider becoming a sacristan for the St. Joseph 4:30 pm Mass.

At weekend Masses, sacristans setup the sacred vessels before Mass and clean them after Mass. Training is provided. Any Catholic serious about their faith is eligible to serve. Can you commit to serving as a sacristan once per month?

6--Help Coordinate Funeral Lyncheons

Are You A Person Who:

- Wants to fulfill the corporal works of mercy to bury the dead and console the grieving?
- Enjoys feeding and serving people?
- Has a gift for hospitality?

Then we need your help!

The St. Charles funeral luncheon ministry needs 1 or 2 more team leader groups. A leader group consists of a 2-person team who will rotate with the other leader teams in planning and running funeral luncheons. Leaders are responsible for determining how many food donations are needed, recruiting volunteers for setting up, picking up supplies for the luncheon and working the luncheon. Training will be provided by the current team leader group.

Please prayerfully discern if you are being called to help with this corporal work of mercy.

Hub team members respond to inquiries about ministries, programs, services and classes. As a Hub team member, you will have the opportunity to get to know fellow parishioners, meet guests and become a parish resource expert.

Other Areas of Need

- 1. Adults & teens to serve as **cantors** (individually or as a team). Adults & students to serve as **instrumentalists**, substitute **musicians** & to join the student & adult **choirs** & **chime choirs** for St. Charles, St. Joseph & St. Mary.
- 2. Persons to serve as **catechists** for fall youth programs and as **Core-team members** for the high school YM3 program.
- 3. Persons to serve on the **St. Charles and St. Joseph-St. Mary Finance Councils**. New members are needed for each council.
- 4. Persons to serve on the **St. Charles Building & Grounds Committee**.
- 5. Persons to serve on the **St. Charles Cemetery Foundation** & the **St. Joseph-St. Mary Cemetery Committee.**
- **6**. Persons to **lead the Rosary before the 11am Mass** on the first Sunday of each month, and every Sunday in May & October.
- 7. Persons with an artistic eye to serve on the **St. Charles Art & Environment Committee** to decorate the Sanctuary with the proper color and flowers for weekend Masses.
- 8. Persons to **assist the parish office with phone calls** for volunteers for Holy Day Masses and information to be updated at the direction of parish staff.
- 9. Persons to lead the St. Joseph Fish Fry dinners.
- 10. Persons to coordinate **Habitat for Humanity** projects for Our Catholic Community.
